

## The Pfizer Institutional Patient Assistance Program (IPAP) At a Glance

## Our Reach:

- Who we are: The Pfizer IPAP helps eligible uninsured patients receive free Pfizer medicines through select health centers, free clinics, and hospitals across the country.
- Who we help: Patients are eligible to receive Pfizer medicine through the Pfizer IPAP if they
  - Are a registered outpatient of an IPAP-participating facility.
  - Have no prescription coverage. Patients must not be covered by any public or private insurance plan that covers
    pharmaceuticals. This includes, but is not limited to, enrollment in Medicaid, Medicare, and Veterans health
    benefits.
  - Have an annual household income at or below 400% of the federal poverty level, adjusted for family size.

Note: Facilities should follow the financial, insurance, and public assistance verification processes in place at their institution to confirm patient eligibility.


